The 6 courses that can be taken as continuing education include: Basic Life Support; Medical Documentation; Medical Terminology; Occupational Safety and Security for Health Professionals; Professional Ethics for Health Professionals; Universal Safety Precautions and Infection Control. The health science courses do not need to be specific to lactation but will be accepted if they are. DSST and CLEP exams may qualify for credits towards these courses. IBLCE does not endorse or recommend courses. The courses can be taken online or in-person but the content should match the content outlined in the IBLCE Health Sciences guide.
- 3. Lactation clinical experience may include in-person consultations, telephone consultations, online lactation support to pregnant and breastfeeding clients, or lactation eduction to families or professionals. Observation or shadowing does not count as clinical hours.
- 4. Recognized health professionals are dentist, dietician, midwife, nurse, physician or medical doctor, occupational therapist, pharmacist, physical therapist or physiotherapist, speech therapist or speech pathologist
